

### Directions to the Bed & Breakfast

## (1) From the West - From Cambridge, Maryland Via Route 50

- \* Take 2nd Exit for Vienna off Route 50 (Rt 331) and enter Vienna town limits
- ❖ At the 2<sup>nd</sup> Stop sign, take a left onto Race Street & go to Nanticoke River
- ❖ Turn right on Water Street
- ❖ 6<sup>th</sup> House on Right, in the middle of the block, is 111 Water Street. It is a white building with a sign with our Blackbird.

### (2) From the East - From Salisbury, Maryland Via Route 50

- ❖ Take the 1st Exit off Route 50 AFTER crossing the Nanticoke River Bridge (about 15 miles from Salisbury) and follow road into the Town of Vienna
- ❖ At the 2<sup>nd</sup> Stop sign, take a left onto Race Street & go to Nanticoke River
- Turn right on Water Street
- 6<sup>th</sup> House on Right, in the middle of the block, is 111 Water Street. It is a white building with a sign with our Blackbird.

# From the North - From the Delaware Bay Bridge - 2 Routes of Choice

# (3) First Option from Delaware Bay Bridge

- Take Route 301 heading towards the Chesapeake Bay Bridge Take Exit for Route 213
- ❖ At Intersect of Route 50 Go South through Easton and Cambridge.
- Complete directions above for '(1) From the West From Cambridge, Maryland Via Route 50'

## (4) Second Option from Delaware Bay Bridge

Take Route 13 South - pass Dover & head towards Salisbury

#### A. Simplist Path

- Continue to Intersect Route 50 turn right (West) onto Rt. 50.
- Complete directions above for '(2) From the East From Salisbury, Maryland Via Route 50'

#### B. Faster & Scenic Path - We Recommend

- At Delmar (on border between Delaware & Maryland), turn right (West) onto Rt. 54 towards Mardela Spring
- ❖ About 10 miles from Rt. 50, you will have to be alert it looks like Rt. 54 curves about 90 degrees to the right-- it does not, that's Route 24. Route 54 goes straight ahead.
- Follow Rt. 54 until it intersects Rt. 50 turn right (West) onto Rt. 50.
- ❖ Complete directions above for '(2) From the East From Salisbury, Maryland Via Route 50'
